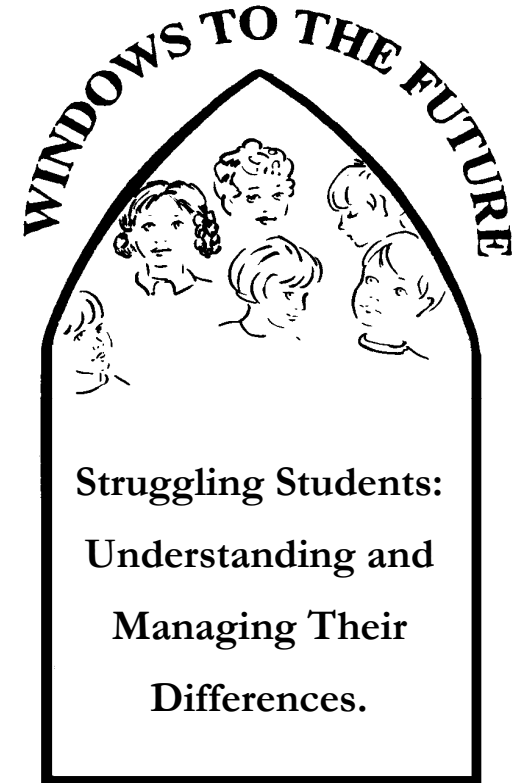

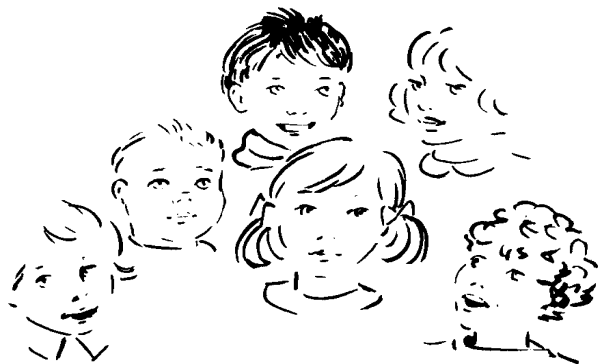

Struggling Students: Understanding and Managing Their Differences.

Dr. Levine will present a framework for thinking about brain differences among elementary, middle and high school students. He will consider in detail eight areas of development that undergo significant changes as children progress through their school years. He will describe ways in which children have difficulty in meeting expectations that stand in the way of success. Dr. Levine will also emphasize issues of diagnosis and means to utilize and cultivate children's unique strengths.

Mel D. Levine, M.D. is an esteemed authority of disorders of childhood such as AD/HD and is a well known author and a gifted speaker. His major research interests are focused on learning processes and the specific dysfunctions that impede the education of many children and adolescents. He is the founder and co-chairman of All Kinds of Minds, a non-profit institute for the understanding of differences in learning, and the author of many books including Ready or Not Here Life Comes, A Mind at a Time, and The Myth of Laziness. He and his wife, Bambi, live on Sanctuary Farm in North Carolina.
